



# Early College High School Initiative By the Numbers

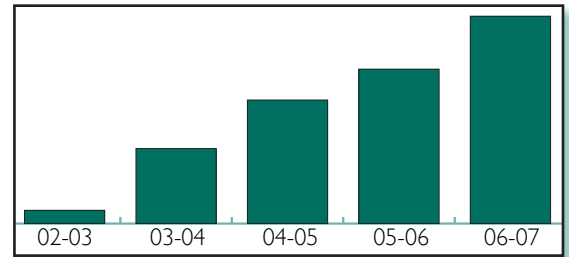
- 239 Number of Schools Anticipated by 2011

## States Represented

## Year Opening

- 3 schools opened in SY 2002-2003
- 17 schools opened in SY 2003-2004

- 35 schools opened in SY 2005-2006
- 47 schools opened in SY 2006-2007



## Types of Schools

- 70% are Public Schools
- 22% are Charter Schools
- 1% each: Contract Schools\*, Magnet Schools, and Private Schools
- 5% are TBD

\* Contract schools are operated by colleges under contract with local districts.

## Locations of Schools

- 58% are on a Postsecondary Campus
- 22% are Off Campus
- 7% are Within a Comprehensive High School
- 3% are on a Native American Reservation
- 2% are on a High School Campus
- 1% are in a Middle School
- 6% are TBD

## Types of Postsecondary Partners

- 59% Two-year Institutions
- 28% Four-year Institutions
- 8% Two-year and Four-year Institutions
- >1% Three-year Institutions
- 5% TBD

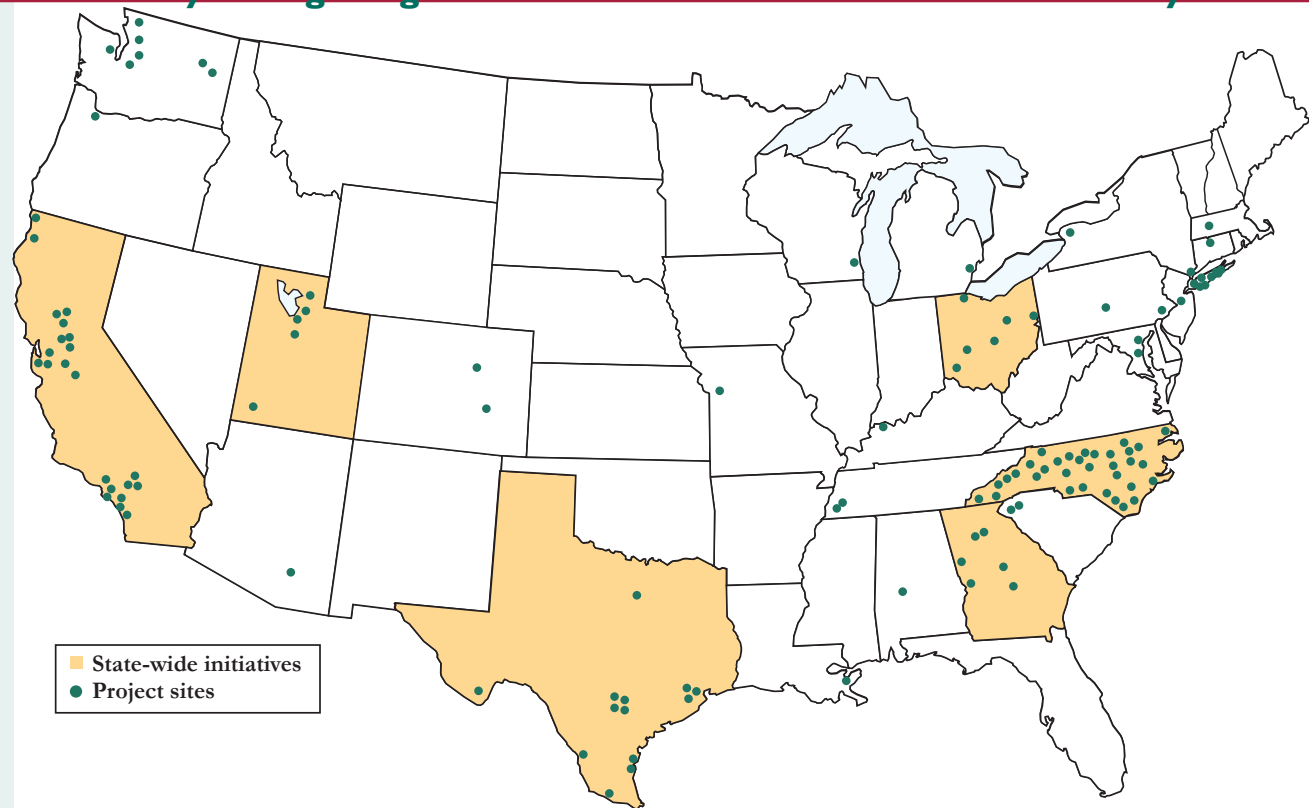

## Early College High Schools and Partners Across the Country



### Early College High Schools

Early college high schools are new institutions that blend high school and college into a coherent educational program:

- Designed so all students can achieve two years of college credit while they are earning a high school diploma.
- Students start college work based on their performance.
- All students prepare to complete a Bachelor's degree.
- By reaching out to middle schools or starting with the seventh grade and providing extensive support, early college high schools ensure that all students are ready for college-level courses in high school.

### The Early College High School Initiative

The Early College High School Initiative is a partnership of fourteen organizations committed to developing high-quality early college high schools across the country.

- Portland Community College: to open 17 schools; nation-wide
- SECME, Inc.: to open 3 schools; nation-wide
- Utah Partnership for Education and Workforce Development: to open 6 schools, Utah
- Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation: to open 14 schools; nation-wide
